#### Ingredients

- 1 broiler/fryer chicken (3-1/2 to 4 pounds), cut up
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 celery ribs, sliced
- 1 large green pepper, cut into strips
- 1/2 pound sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1 can (28 ounces) tomatoes, drained and chopped
- 1 can (8 ounces) tomato sauce
- 1 can (6 ounces) tomato paste
- 1 cup dry red wine or water
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- Hot cooked pasta
- Grated Parmesan cheese

#### **Directions:**



- 1. Dust chicken with flour. Season with salt and pepper. In a large skillet, brown chicken on all sides in oil and butter over medium-high heat. Remove chicken to platter.
- 2. In the same skillet, cook and stir the onion, celery, pepper and mushrooms for 5 minutes. Stir in the tomatoes, tomato sauce, tomato paste, wine, herbs, garlic and sugar. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 30 minutes.
- 3. Return chicken to skillet. Cover and simmer for 45-60 minutes or until chicken is tender. Serve over pasta and sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.

#### Sectional Champs

Head Coach Devin Sutliff started her volleyball coaching career at South Decatur eight years ago, and she and her teams have flipped the script since then, ending the 2024 season as both Mid-Hoosier Conference and Sectional 59 Champions. The Lady Cougars took the sectional title for the first time since 1998, and had several players named to the All-MHC and All-Sectional teams. Sutliff was also named MHC Coach of the Year. The program has seen a big culture shift since Sutliff took over as head coach five years ago.

With players like seniors Makayla Somers, Paige McQueen, Lydia Winkler, and Anniston Bostic, the team had plenty of leadership to help guide them to victory.

"I have worked with Makayla, Paige, and Lydia for four years, but I have been watching them play since they were 7th graders," she said. "Seeing their growth on and off the court has been amazing."

Sutliff only worked with Bostic for one year, but watched her and coached against her at Hauser prior to this season.

"Replacing the seniors is going to be hard," Sutliff said, "and moments in my classroom are going to be somber if not next year."

Reminiscing about the historical season, Coach Sutliff recalls one of her favorite memories. She admits one bright spot was the takedown of rival North Decatur. "When [the girls] beat North for the first time, I couldn't help but cry tears of joy because of the happiness radiating from them," Sutliff said.

"They were so proud of what they accomplished, and they became the team I always knew they could be."

Sutliff saw this not only as a powerful moment in their season, but also as the time the players finally started to believe in themselves.

"As we went on to win the conference and sectionals, their pride and happiness blossomed even more. For the first time in four years, they were able to truly believe in themselves."

One cannot single-handedly shift the culture of a volleyball program, and Sutliff has surrounded herself with exceptional assistant coaches who help better the team. Sutliff credits Tyler Ewing, Zoey Alexander, and Lisa Bennett as key pieces to the recipe for success.

"Tyler showed the girls that they were worthy of greatness," she said about her first assistant coach. "He provided the insight our girls were often too driven through the night to root for the girls during Regionals this year." Sutliff said Coach Alexander reminded herself when she first began coaching.

"Zoey embodies pride for both the team and the school," she stated. "She is determined to push forward and settle for nothing less than excellence."

Sutliff credits Lisa Bennett, who has never wavered in her faith in what the team could achieve, with making her the coach she is today.

"She has taught me how to balance intensity with fun, serving as the yin to my yang in coaching," she said. "Lisa has always believed in me, especially during my moments of self-doubt. She always reassured me that things were working the way they were supposed to."

The promise of striving for greatness will continue in a lasting program full of accolades for years to come. Sutliff will look to some of the younger players with bright futures to continue the success of the program.

"I have plenty of girls growing and more coming in as freshmen," she said. "We're planning on more smiles, laughs, jokes, and fun. The Lady Cougars are just getting started."
